FTP Tutorial using Filezilla

Okland Construction no longer supports the use of Internet Explorer for use with its FTP site. Please download Filezilla and install. The following pages will give you a quick tutorial on how to “download” and/or “upload” to the FTP site.




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In your browser enter:
`ftp://support:pc@ftp.okland.com/filezilla.exe`



Save this file and install this application



Ask your network administrator to install or help you install this program if needed

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You should have a new icon. If not check under your programs menu in Windows


1 Step 1. Enter the name of the site you want to connect. (i.e. ftp.okland.com)

2 Step 2. If you have a user name and password, enter this information here:
If not leave it blank. The default "anonymous" account will be used.

All files will be downloaded to the path indicated here


4 Browse to the desired file on the FTP Site:

3 Step 3. Click "Quickconnect"



Depending on the username entered, contents may vary

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6 Step 6: Right click and choose "Download" (or double click). Files will be downloaded.

5 Step 5: Browse to the location on your PC where you will download your file to

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Step 7: Disconnect when complete.

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Uploading Files (sending files from your PC to the FTP site)
